9. There are seven novels in the Harry Potter series. There are seven players on a Quidditch team. There are seven secret passageways out of the castle.

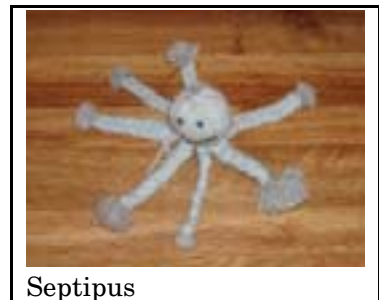
10. Muslim pilgrims walk around the Kaaba seven times.

21. There are seven stars in the constellation Ursa Major.

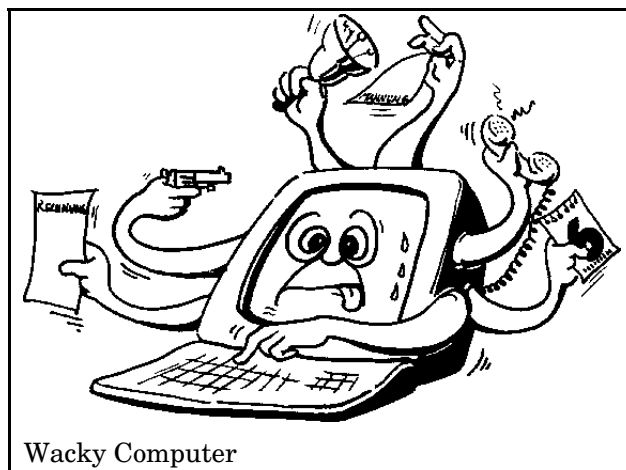
22. There are seven notes in the music scale.
